

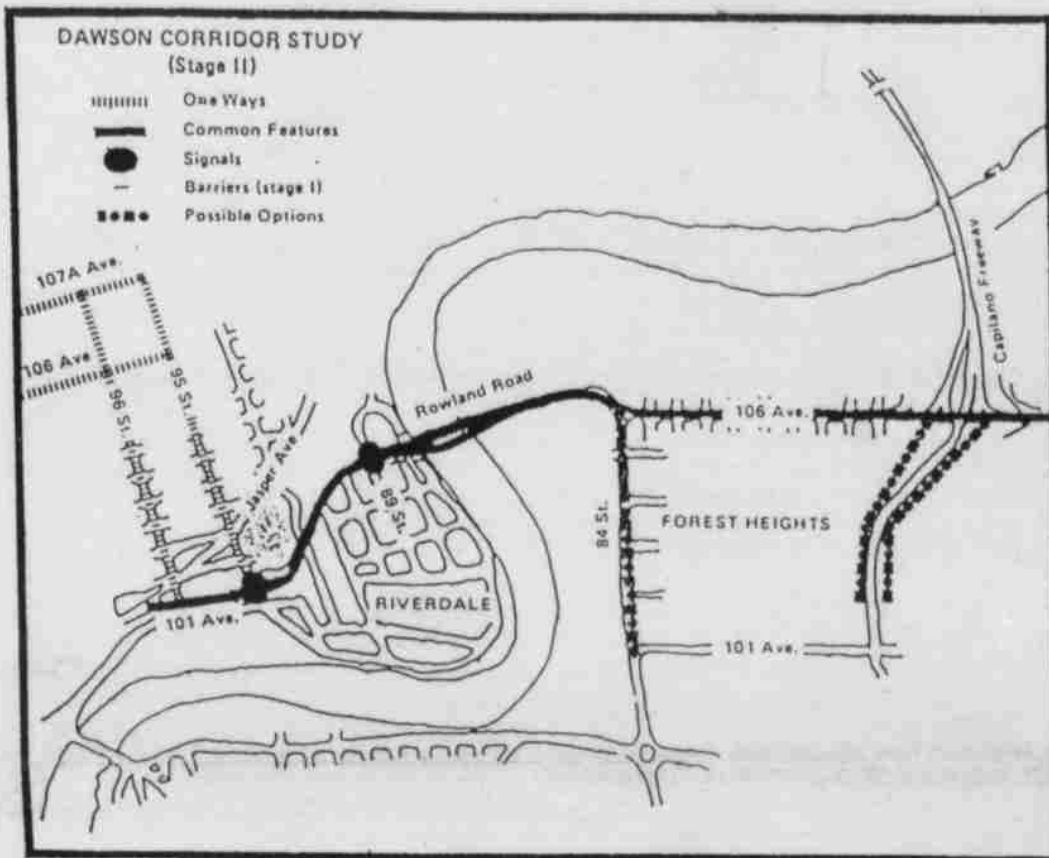

No Public Meeting on Dawson Corridor



A proposed expansion of the Dawson Bridge, doubling its present size, threatens residents of Boyle Street and McCauley. Such a proposal if implemented would increase traffic on all streets in Boyle Street and McCauley increasing the already to numerous traffic hazards faced by residents.

Transportation System Design has planned no public meetings for the Boyle Street and McCauley areas. The Dawson Bridge expansion would be an integral part of a plan to create a traffic loop through the inner city to bypass the downtown. Such an inner loop would create islands of residential populations surrounded by arterial roadways.

Health Centre - Better for Less

"The Boyle McCauley Health Centre provides better health care for less" was the conclusion of the two year evaluation of the Health Centre. The evaluation of the Centre shows that it does indeed meet the needs of area residents and that it requires the services of another doctor, says Estelle Demers of the Health Centre Evaluation Committee in her report to the Health Centre Annual Meeting.

Short reports from board committees were heard, giving a brief overview of the years activities. Of current interest is the development of a pilot project utilising neighborhood health workers as a first contact for many area residents.

A neighborhood health worker would be someone who has lived in the community for a number of years and has gained the trust and respect of other residents. They would receive instruction in health care and medical and non-medical resources available to Boyle Street and McCauley. They would serve to educate their peers in preventative health care and refer individuals for treatment where appropriate.

A musical staff report gave tribute in song to the "quirks and Quarks" of the staff members.

The evening ended with song and refreshments. Many individuals used the opportunity to talk casually with the staff and board.

In Search of Shelter

Nobody wants to house single mothers with three or more children, seniors with multiple disabilities, discharged mental patients or people with a history of house wrecking. A statement of the obvious arising from "Search for Shelter", a workshop on developing housing alternatives for the hard to house.

On May 13, 1982, six women calling themselves The Housing Information Project, sponsored a workshop entitled "Search for Shelter". The workshop focused on the specific housing needs of the four hard to house populations listed above.

Dr. Ann McAfee, a housing planner for the City of Vancouver, gave the opening address. Since 1974 Ann has been responsible for housing policy planning and for implementation of special housing programs in Vancouver. Her talk reflected her long experience in and extensive knowledge of the housing system, and challenged all participants to engage themselves in a process of articulating a city-wide housing policy. Ann helped to de-mystify the housing system, making the problems manageable and solveable.

A panel presentation focused on the four hard to house populations. Boyle Street Co-op, Operation Friendship, Canadian Mental Health Assoc., WIN House, Canative Housing, Norwood School and the Alberta Status of Women Action Committee participated in the preparation of talks.

Seventy-five people responded to the invitation of the organizers. The workshop brought together decision-makers in housing programs at the municipal, provincial and federal levels with housing placement work-

ers in social service agencies. The afternoon was spent in four workshops, with each workshop reflecting a cross-section of government and agency personnel. From the perspective of a specific needs group, each workshop examined the present housing system to discover possible solutions.



The "discharged mental patients" group formed an on-going task force to develop solution proposals. The "house wreckers" group and "single mothers" groups produced lists of persons interested in doing some follow-up. The "multi-problem" seniors group resulted in some people expressing willingness to work with the staff of Operation Friendship. A proposal came forth to form a group to put together a co-ordinating secretariate for housing.

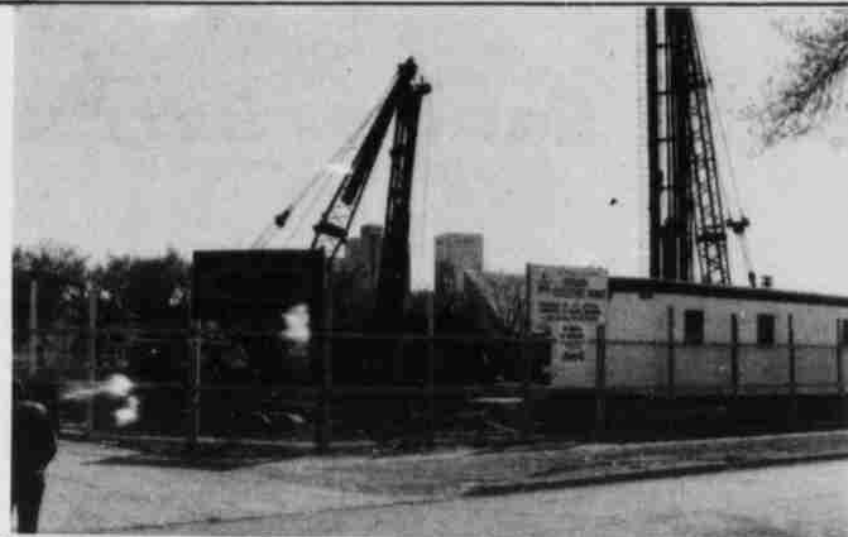

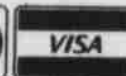

Is Your Child Protected ?

"Is your child protected", is the theme of the June, 1982 Pre-school Immunization Campaign, sponsored by the Local Board of Health.

In 1982 approximately 7500 Edmonton children will register for Kindergarten classes for the coming year. In some areas, as many as 20% of the children will not have completed the immunization to protect them against Measles, Diptheria, Whooping Cough, Tetanus and Polio. Effective and free vaccines are available through Regional Health Clinics.

Immunization shots given to children, stimulate the body to produce its own protective antibodies against these communicable diseases. To assure a good level of protection the Local Board of Health

recomends a child receive immunization for diptheria, whooping cough, tetanus and polio at 2 months, 4 months, 6 months, 18 months and 4½ years. Immunization for measles should be given after the first year.

The Local Board of Health strongly recomends that parents with pre-school age children check their children's immunization record to ensure that he or she is receiving adequate coverage.

After School Assurances

Cathy Smey, director of McCauley After School Care, has recieved a verbal communication for the city that funding for the centre is assured for another year.

Ms. Smey was informed that After School Care made it through the City Budget and that funding will be secure for another year.

Cathy sees this as vital in order to fill spots for next fall.

"Parents require the assurance that the facility will meet their needs for a long period of time, so that they can feel secure."

This fall the After School Care will be open school days before classes, at noon and after school. As well the centre will be open for professional development days and holidays such as Christmas and Spring break.

Summer programming starts soon.

The centre will be open weekdays from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm. Activities will range from swimming to field trips, day camp, sports, games and much more. The program will tap the facilities of Parks and Recreation, Bissell and Sacred Heart Community School.

Day Care Open

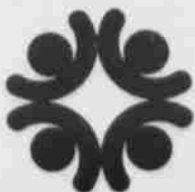
